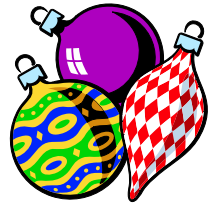


I would like to thank everyone who helps in putting together our Smokes publication. Each month there are a number of individuals that continually step up to help out. Your assistance has been truly appreciated.

Directions from I-71 South and Route 42(Pearl Road): Take Route 42 south toward Strongsville for approximately 1 1/2 miles to Valley Parkway(5th traffic light). Turn left(south) onto Valley Parkway and continue for 1 1/2 miles. Turn right into the Chalet entrance.

Winter Campout

January 27th - 29th, Camp Y-Noah

This year's CVNSND Winter Campout will be held January 27th thru the 29th at Camp Y-Noah. This campout is always loads of fun, with sled riding (weather permitting), winter hiking, BB guns, horseback riding, "Christmas at Camp Y-Noah", a torch march and Saturday night skits. The cost will be \$125 for a father and (1) child, with a charge of \$40 for each additional child. Horseback trail riding will be available to children ages 8 and over at a cost of \$10/rider. Ring rides will be offered for children ages 7 and under at a cost of \$5/rider.

Each child should bring their own sled (for safety reasons, NO METAL RUNNER SLEDS, please). Please have the owner's NAME clearly marked on each sled.

Directions:

Take I-77 South about 30 miles to Exit 120, Arlington Road. Take Arlington Road 6 miles south and turn right on Mt. Pleasant Road. Take Mt. Pleasant Road approximately 1/2 mile and turn right into the Camp Y-Noah entrance.

- Plan on arriving on Friday evening at 7:00 p.m. for check-in.
- Don't forget plenty of warm, dry clothes, extra mittens, boots, etc.!

Pine Car Derby

Son's and Daughter's, it's time to get your racecars ready for the annual Pine Car Derby. This will be a family event. Car kits and weights will be sold at the Late Nighter and Winter Campout. You can also contact Salvatore Messina (440-740-0265, gmessina@gcpartnership.com) to obtain a kit.

A few rules to keep in mind when designing your car:

- You may only use authorized car kits purchased from NS/ND. Other "Boy Scout" cars and other kits may have different dimensions – do not use these cars. There is no height or length regulation, but the maximum width is 2 ¾ inches. And remember only authorized car kits can be used. You may relocate the placement of the wooden dowel axles. But the axles themselves can not be altered
- The maximum allowable weight is 5 ounces. You may add weights (e.g., washers, coins) to the kit. The weights sold by NS/ND are perfect for getting the car up to the maximum weight. Each car will be officially weighed at the event. Consider using a Post Office scale to check the weight prior to race day. A scale and several stations will be available at the event where you can add and subtract weight. Please bring your own tools. There will be a limited amount of weights and car parts available on race day.
- The maximum width is 2 ¾ inches. There are no length or height regulations.
- You cannot substitute any car components – the wheels, wooden dowel axle housings, axle screws, and pine block provided with the kit must be used. Do not use any type of bearings, washers, Teflon parts, etc. on the axles and do not modify the wheels. The pine block can be shaped. Paint and other decorative items can be added to the kit as long as the car remains within the maximum dimensions.
- Powdered graphite is the only lubricant allowed and will be provided at the event.
- Cars from previous years may be used as long as they meet the above guidelines.



The doors will open at 12:00 noon. Cars will be weighed and registered from 12:00 to 12:45 PM. There will be a registration fee for each car (new or used). Racing is scheduled to begin at 1:00 PM. Please arrive early if your car needs fine-tuning.

Prizes will be awarded for the 1) fastest cars in each nation, 2) best looking design and 3) most creative design. Frank Madonia has offered to bring in his racecar and challenge the children in the Reaction Time test prior to race time. Reaction time trophies will also be awarded. Food and refreshments will be available for purchase.
